SOK Genealogy: Barvalis Klock married Feb. 29, 1718. Christian Nellis, born 1697, died 1771, who probably was a son of Johan George Nellis, or Johan William, who came with the Palatines in 1710--14. Christian is buried in the Old Klock cemetery east of St. Johnsville, N.Y., and it is likely that Barvalis is buried there, also, although the stone next to that of Christian's bears no name of date.

Notes for JOHAN LEONARD HELMER:

Johan Leonard Helmer was born between 1715 and 1730. He died by 1766. He married about 1749, Catherine Nellis who was born in 1724 and died about 1805. She was the daughter of Christian Nellis and Barvalis Klock. Catherine was the widow of Adam Zimmerman. Catherine later married Col. Jacob Klock.

Notes for ADAM ZIMMERMAN:

Adam was the eldest son of Jacob and Anna Margaretha Schultz Zimmerman. Jacob was considered the founder of what is now St. Johnsville. He had a gristmill and traded with the Indians.

Notes for JACOB KLOCK:

Jacob Klock was an officer in the French and Indian War where he was taken prisoner. He was a Captain in the Second Battalion Albany County Militia during that war. Albany and Montgomery County were same county at that time. He was also in the Revolutionary War. He commanded the 2nd. Reg't., Tyron County, New York State Militia. He was known as Col. Jacob Klock.

Col. Jacob Klock also signed the Mohawk Valley Declaration of Independence.

He was married to Catharina Nellis Helmer, daughter of Christian and Barbara (Klock) Helmer. He was also married to Elizabeth Bellinger.

Jacob Klock. He served as the colonel of the Palatine District Regiment of Militia, and is stated to have often been in the command of Fort Plank in 1779 and 1780. (James Barhyte, RWPA # S12948; Samuel French RWPA #s29163; Gansevoort Military Papers NYSA) During the Revolutionary War Colonel Klock possessed 325 acres of land in Lot 13 of the Harrison Patent (Certificates of Quit Rent Remissions, Mss#A1211, Box D7816)---Ken D. Johnson, The Bloodied Mohawk.

Col. Jacob Klock was born on 8 Oct 1708. He died on 11 May 1798.---Date of Birth of Col. Jacob Klock from the Billinger Family Tree on the Internet "Descendants of Hans Bellinger Fifth Generation" Genealogy of the Bellinger's and allied families Pioneer settlers of the Mohawk Valley, New York. The Genealogy of the Mohawk Valley Bellingers and Allied Families by Lyle Frederick Bellinger gives the date of birth of Jacob Klock as October 8, 1705 or 1708. I am using the 1705 date in my tree. Gens Web also has the date of birth of Jacob Klock as Oct 8, 1805.

Jacob married Catharine NELLIS, daughter of Christian NELLIS and Barvalis KLOCK, on 27 Jul 1781 in , , New York. (Catharine NELLIS was born on 23 Dec 1723-18 Jan 1724 in , , New York, died on 20 Aug 1805 in St. Johnsville, Montgomery, New York and was buried in St. Johnsville, Montgomery, New York.)--SZT

Although it is generally accepted that Jacob Klock was the son of Hendrick Klock, no one really knows his exact date of birth or if he was the son of Hendrick Klock. The following is from Jephtha Simms. He places the colonel as the son of old George Klock, not the brother.

It is difficult to locate all the prominent citizens of this vicinity in their own little castles. Next to Fort Hess seems to have been Fort Klock, a palisaded stone house then owned and occupied by John Klock, father of Adam Klock, which house is yet standing over a mile to the eastward of St. Johnsville. At a southeast upper window of this

house, the widow of Peter Haner was standing on the day of Johnson's invasion, when a bullet, near spent, struck her head, and she sat down stunned but not seriously hurt. I am glad that this old landmark, which is a very ancient building, is allowed to remain. The dwelling of Old George Klock, as called to distinguish him from his son, I infer, stood not far above John Klock's and was perhaps best known as Fort Klock. He had two sons, Col. Jacob and George, and a daughter Margaret, who married Col. Ebenezer Cox--and after his death at Oriskany, married Hunter Quackenbush. Col. Klock, who married a daughter of Christian Nellis, then a widow Helmer, lived where Jonas Snell now lives, three-fourths of a mile below the village. The place has never been out of the Klock family, and Mrs. Snell was a Klock. On the land of one of the Klocks' was erected at an early period, a Reformed Dutch** Church, a small edifice built of wood. It has neither steeple or bell, but had the sounding board of the times, over its one man pulpit. This church had some seats to accommodate Indian hearers. Domine Gros occasionally preached in this church before the Revolution. Rev. Henry Dyslin, reputed a good scholar, was one of its last pastors. George Bauder, a Stone Arabia boy of the revolution, assured the writer that the first Sabbath after his marriage in Kingsbush, he took his wife to this church. He thought the edifice was demolished about the year 1818. He died at Palatine Bridge, 1857 or 1858.--Henry Smith and others. The Frontiersmen of New York by Jephtha R. He also was a member of the first State Senate.---The Family Tree of Ronald ORourke has Jacob died 10 Sept. 1814 in St. Johnsville, New York.

Notes from the Sherman O. Klock Genealogy:

Jacob G. Klock was born March 9, 1738, died Sept 19, 1814, married 1st. April 7, 1763, Anna Nellis, daughter of Christian Nellis.

Jacob G. Klock married 2nd, Maritje Beekman, born in Kingston, N.Y. Jan. 16, 1758, died May 3, 1836. They were married Sept. 30, 1784. She was the daughter of Cornelius Beekman and Catrina Schoomaker the daughter of Hendrick Schoomaker and Tryntje Osterout. Catrina was born March 13, 1736. Cornelius Beekman was born Sept. 3, 1733, and was the 8th child of Thomas Beekman and Maria Wynkoop and Judickje Bloodgood.

Thomas Beekman, born April 13, 1689 at New York, died in Kingston July 11, 1759, married Maria Wynkoop, Jan. 14, 1715, at Kinston, N.Y. He was the son of Johannes Beekman, baptised Nov. 22, 1656, and Aeltja Thomas Poppinga, who he married in New York March 4, 1685. She was the daughter of Thomas Laurensen Poppinga from Groeninger, and widow Haritje Jans.

Johannes Beekman was the son of William Beekman born April 28, 1623 at Hasselt in Oberyssal, died Sept. 21, 1707, and Catalint De Boog from Amsterdam, whom he married Sept 5, 1649 in New York. She was the daughter of Hendrick De Boog and _____ Stagboom.

William Beekman was the son of Hendrick Beekman born Sept. 14, 1585 and who lived at Keulen. He was married three times, Most of descendants are from his 2nd. wife, Maria Baudartins (possibly the present day Bauder) the daughter of the Rev. William Baudertins.

Maria Beekman, baptised June 26, 1650, was a daughter of the above Hendrick Beekman. She was the 1st. wife of Nicholas Stuyvesant, son of Gov. Peter Stuyvesant, who she married May 5, 1672. She died before 1681.

Jacob G. Klock was the man whose name appeared on the Oriskany Monument from the time of its erection, and dedication which occurred August 6, 1884, till the 150th anniversary August 6, 1927, when the initial G. was erased, leaving it as it should be, Col. Jacob Klock. (see line of Jacob Klock (No. 4)

I find no record of Jacob G. Klock having served either as an officer or private in the Revolution. This may be due to the fact that when the trying days of 1776 came, and a state government was formed the following year, and when the assembly met at Kingston in September of that year, he was there as representative from Tryon county. This was a month after the battle of Oriskany was fought, and while he may have taken part in that battle, there is no evidence to show that he did. Probably his on-coming duties as the representative of Tyron county prevented him from being there. Nothing else I am sure would have prevented it, for there is no question about his patriotism. Had he been otherwise he wouldn't have been called to represent the patriots of Tyron county.

He served in that capacity until the year 1784, Besides being senator for the western district, he was made one of the four Commissioners of forfeiture for the western district, which comprised Albany and Tyron counties. He served in this capacity for October 22, 1779 until March 21, 1788, when the office was abolished. This too, was a very important office. On February 2, 1778, he was appointed Judge of Montgomery county, which was changed from Tyron to Montgomery, in resentment of the Colonial Governor Tyron, and in honor of General Montgomery. He served in this capacity as late May 1, 1887, when he appeared at the proof of the will of his uncle Johannes, the son of Hendrick first settler. And again we find him as commissioner of highways in the year 1786. This too was a most important commission at that time.

Had George Klock, his father, been as villainous as painted by Sir William Johnson, this son would hardly have been selected to fill the important positions he did. Reared as he was in a wilderness filled with wild beasts, and withing sight of the willage of the Mohawks across the river from his rede habitation, he seems somehow to have received a better education than most of those of his day. He was an excellent penman, as numerous papers, bearing his writing, in my possession show. He also belonged to the Masonic lodge.

Anna Eva Zimmerman was born 4 February 1743 the daughter of Adam Zimmerman and Catharina Nellis. Catharina Nellis was the daughter of Christian Nellis and Barvalis Elizabeth Klock. Adam was the eldest son of Jacob and Anna Margaretha Schultz Zimmerman. Jacob was considered the founder of what is now St. Johnsville. He had a gristmill and traded with the Indians. Anna Eva Zimmerman married John Markell about 1756, which was near the beginning of the French and Indian War. They had a residence in the western part of Minden. In the summer of 1757, John Markell, Anna and their infant child went to go visit a neighbor. Anna was carrying the child in her arms when in their path they met a dozen armed unfriendly Indians. John Markell saw them and knowing that their escape was impossible, said in German to his wife, who was directly behind him, "Anna our time is up." These were his dying words for in an instant; one of the party sent a bullet through his body which lodged in hers. They both fell to the ground.

Her husband John was tomahawked and scalped. She was wounded and lying on the ground helpless when an Indian drew his knife and scalped her and killed the infant child while she watched. The Indians then went on to the Markell homestead to see what they could plunder. Anna Eva was conscious throughout the ordeal and managed to get up and walk to the neighbors' house for help. She was treated and recovered. She carried the bullet to her grave.

Anna Eva later remarried Christian Getman of Ephratah in 1760. She died April 25, 1822 at the age of 85. She had 10 children by her second marriage. Anna concealed the loss of her scalp by combing her hair over the area. Others recalled that she wore a small, black velvet skullcap in winter and combed her hair over her scalped spot when the weather

was hot. Catharina was the second daughter of Adam and Catharine Zimmerman. She was born about 1745. She married Frederick Snell, Jr. at the Stone Arabia Reformed

Church, Albany Co., New York on March 4, 1766. He was born in Stone Arabia 1741. Frederick Snell and Catherine had seven children. Frederick Snell Jr. was killed at the

Battle of Oriskany on August 6 1777. Then on June 6, 1786 she married Bastian Stemler. Catherine and Bastian Stemler had two children.

On March 4, 1766 she married Frederick Snell, Jr. who was born about 1741. Frederick Snell enlisted in the military when he was 18 and fought in the French and Indian war and fought in the Revolutionary War under Col. Jacob Klock. Frederick was killed in the battle of Oriskany on August 6, 1777. Frederick and Catharine had seven children. Catharine was an even-tempered woman and made a good pioneer's wife. On April 30, 1780, after the death of her husband, she was fixing pancakes for her children when there was an Indian Raid on Shell's Bush. Freddie, the son of Frederick and Catharine, saw the Indians coming and hid in the bake oven. The Indians broke into the house and helped themselves to the food. They made Catharine sit against the wall with her children. The Indians made her watch as they killed her children... Catherine was later found on the road by soldiers, who were hot on the trail of the Indians, she was scalped and senseless. She survived the attack, but two of her children died. She later married Bastian Stamm and she had one more child, Magdalena Stamm and they moved to Jefferson County, New York.

John Klock (No. 211) born Dec. 28, 1771, died Dec. 20, 1852, was born at "Old Fort Klock", and as a boy witnessed the horrors that confronted those who lived in the path of the ruthless mob of Tories and Indians who swept thru the valley with scalping knife and flaming torch, leaving nought but desolation on every side.

As a boy he saw those depart, at the call of General Herkimer, for the bloody field of Oriskany, and heard the cry of sorrow of those afflicted, who mourned the loss of those whose bones lay bleaching on the fateful, but triumphant field of battle. Heard the rattle of musketry 'round-a-bout "Old Fort Klock" at the battle of "Klock's Field" and saw the minions of King George flee to the westward in disordered route.

He saw service in the war of 1812, and was stationed at Sackets Harbor, and later at Ogdensburg, N.Y. He was known as Major after the war, altho no proof has been established that he ever held the rank of one. Tradition in the family says, that while stationed there, his son Abraham, then a boy in his early teens, road a horse from Old Fort Klock to Sackets Harbor for the use of his father who was then stationed there. If this be true, then no doubt he was a non-commissioned officer of some sort.

Enchanted perhaps by the valley thru which ran the great river on whose banks he had bivwacked as a soilder, he decided to leave valley of the Mohawk, and in the year 1836-7 he removed to St. Lawrence county N.Y., where he

purchased a large track of timber land on the west shore of Black lake, which became known as Klock's Bush in later years. This was a virgin wilderness, and the way hither from the Mohawk valley was the same, and transportation was by means of heavy wagons and slow going oxen.

With John and his wife Nancy, came Abraham, Danial, and Christian, sons of John's by his second wife Elizabeth Nellis; also Isaac, Jacob, Luther and Margaret, by his third wife Anna (Nancy) Putman. All of these children were married at that time, and those by his second wife had offspring who were born in the Mohawk Valley.

A road was hewed out of the forest thru this track of timber land, that led from the lake road to the highway that ran from Hammond to Ogdensburg, and along it some of these sons and Margaret's husband, Joseph Weaver, settled. It bacame known as the "Klock Road" and is so known to this day.

John Klock appears to have been known as John J. Klock Jr., but his tombstone bares the inscription, JOHN KLOCK, without the middle initial as do records in the "Sand Hill" church books extant in the Utica Library as well as those of the St. John's Reformed church books at St. Johnsville N.Y. where his name, and that of his wife appears. He and his 3rd. wife are buried at "The Cedars" on the shore of Black Lake, near Edwardsville, St. Lawrence Co. N.Y.

The Head Stone of John Klock has broken off and is missing. His wife, Nancy stone is still there. (2005) With his first wife, Elizabeth Lampman I have Catharine, born March 05, 1796; Elizabeth (Betsy), born November 22, 1797. With his second wife, Elizabeth Nellis I have Abraham, born August 31, 1800; Daniel J., born May 01, 1802; Dorothy, born September 06, 1805 and Christian, born August 17, 1806; With his third wife, Nancy I have Lucinda, born in 1817; Margaret born December 02, 1814; Dorothy born May 25, 1810; Isaac Putman born in 1812; Jacob born January 06, 1822; Luther born March 06, 1819; and Peter May 10, 1825.

John Klock being duly swarn saith that in the year 1780 or there about as he now recollects in the month of October of said year he was in the Fort at John Klock the Desponent's grandfather in the District then called Palatine, now the Town of St. Johnsville, at the time when Sir John passed throught the valley of the Mohawk with his army burnt and destroyed buildings and grain and crows. Deponent said Crouse and others in the Fort say at the time that said Crouse had shot an Indian or Tory off his horse and that the horse immediately came running up to the fort with baggage fastened on his back and neck. Deponent says that the said Crouse took possession of the horse. The same day the said Leonard Crouse and others in the fort went in pursuit of Sir John and his army and overtook them on the flats of Richard Failing about one mile west of said Fort where said Crouse and others from the Fort had a battle with the enemy and drove them across the Mohawk river. Deponent was himself a spectator of said battle.

Deponent also says that said Leonard Crouse and Lany Klock lived together as man and wife and had children together for about nineteen or twenty years as Deponent now recollects.

Christian Klock, after the death of Col. Jacob Klock in 1798, lived on the homestead farm of the Colonel who had willed it to Christian's wife Eva, and who came into possession of it upon her grand father death. The old dwelling place of the Colonel, which had witnessed many stirring scenes during the Revolution, and which had escaped the torch of the incendiaries who ran mad throughout the valley, was torn down about the year 1830, and a new house erected in its place; this building is still standing (1932) and is owned by the widow of the late Sheldon Klock, who bought the house and lot from the Snell estate. I might add that Sheldon Klock, was not closely related to Christian Klock, or his wife Eva, and did not inherit this property as has been said. Sheldon Klock married a Powell for his first wife, and the widow of John F. Klock for his second. The maiden name of his second wife was Lillian Richards, the daughter of Warren Richards.

Near this home, and perhaps on the very spot, Hendrick Klock the pioneer settler built his dwelling of logs not later than 1723, and near there he spent his remaining days. Near it once stood the old Klock Church, and close by it the old Klock burial ground, where now lie many of name with unmarked graves. This Klock Church probably was built about 1750, and by Colonel Jacob Klock. Christian Klock served in the war of 1812 as Lieut. of the 1st. Regt. N.Y.S. militia.

Christian and his family moved to Michigan around 1858. (According to page 488 of the book, "History of Allegan and Berry Counties, Michigan." I think it was more like 1851 or 1852. This comes from that book:

"In 1851, when Franklin Bliss settled on section 24, where Leonard Wilcox, now of Irving, had made a clearing of 2 acres, he had no neighbor on the north except an Indian called, " Chippewa", who owned 40 acres on section 1 and lived in a log cabin. At that time a well-traveled stage-road crossed the Bliss' farm,-- the one which ran between Grand Rapids and Hastings. Farther north Solomon Clark settled on Section 12 in 1854, and beyond that C.I. Klock located in 1858 on section 2. Mr Klock now lives on section 2 with John Moxon who came with him into the township. Klock's neighbors on the south were Cornelius Walrath and his sons; On the north John Klock and Henry Smith; on the west, the Forbes family; and on the east, John Moe and a Mr. Badgrow. That same spring, Simeon Lawrence settled on section 11. At that day the northeastern portion of the township was a new country for until than the land-owners had chosen to discourage settlements by holding the property out of the market. After 1858, however, the population began multiply rapidly, and the locality is now well peopled, containing, moreover, many valuable farms."

John Klock, was the son of Abraham Klock, brother of Christian, lived on the North of Christian Klock, The Walrath's that lived south of the Klock's was also related thru Margaret Walrath.
