Earle gave me some genealogy information on his family while he was here which I have added to my tree.

August 11, was a busy day at Fort Klock, along with Earle and his family we had about

30 members of the Dillenbeck Family. The Dillenbeck's had a family reunion and part of their reunion was a visit and tour of Fort Klock. Several members of the Dillenbeck family married into the Klock family. Alexander Dillenbeck married Magdalena Klock; David C. Dillenbeck married Cora Rice, who was a granddaughter of Eva Klock; Ezra L. Dillenbeck married Bertha H. Klock; Gertrude Dillenbeck married Andrew Bauder, a descendant of Michael Bauder and Magdalena (Lena) Klock; Hanna Dillenbeck married Rufus Bauder, another descendant of Michael Bauder and Magdalena Klock. Lucretia Dillenbeck married Levi R. Klock. Magdalena Dillenbeck married George Getman, another descendant of Michael Bauder and Magdalena Klock and Susannah Dillenbeck married Phillip Klock. These are just a few of the connections between the Klock and Dillenbeck family.

We also had a visit from Kathleen Don and her sister. Kathleen is the widow of William Don. She lives in Edenton, North Carolina; she was here to bury the ashes of her husband in the St. Johnsville cemetery. I put the obituary of William Don in last month's issue of Klock Connections. William was the son of Frank Don and Frank was the brother of Alex Klock Don. Alex was the owner of Fort Klock when Skip Barshied and the Tryon County Mussel Loaders were able to acquire a long term lease on Fort Klock. After the death of Alex, his wife Mable Don deeded the property over to the group.

As you can see, a lot of Klock descendants visit the fort every month. I enjoy talking with them exchanging genealogy information and showing them around the old Klock Homestead.

### **Anna Eva Timmerman Survived Scalping During the French and Indian War and Lived to a Good Old Age**

Anna Eva Timmerman, (Zimmerman) was born February 4, 1736. She was the daughter of Adam Zimmerman and Catharina Nellis. Catherina Nellis was the daughter of Christian Nellis and Barvalis Klock. Barvalis Klock was the daughter of Hendrick Klock.

Christian Nellis married Barvalis Klock, the daughter of Hendrick Klock about February 28, 1717/18 in Palatine, Montgomery Co. New York. Christian and Barvalis had eight children. One of these children was Catharina Nellis. Catharina was married three times. She was married to Johan Leonard Helmer and had four children. She also married Adam Zimmerman and had three children, including Anna Eva Timmerman who is the subject of this article. Catherina also married Col. Jacob Klock, no children from this marriage.

Anna Eva Timmerman married John Markell. John, Anne and their baby was attacked by Indians during the French and Indian wars. John Markell was shot and their child murdered. Anne was scalped and left for dead, but she was not dead. She made her way to the road where she was found. This was to the western part of Minden, near St. Johnsville. She recovered and later married Christian Getman of Ephratah.

## **Survived Scalping Continued**

Christian Getman and Eva had several children. Among her six sons born after her marriage to Getman, was Peter, a Revolutionary war pensioner. Anne died in April 1821.

Funeral services for Texas Tech professor Sheldon Klock Jr., 62, will be at 2:30 p.m. today at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church. He will be buried at Resthaven Memorial Park.

Klock, who taught Portuguese and Spanish in the Classical and Modern Languages department, had been at Tech since 1963. Klock died Monday at University Medical Center of heart failure. Peder Christiansen, chairman of the Department of Classical and Modern Languages and Literature, said they had known he was ill, but his death still came as a surprise. "We were concerned from some time," Christiansen said. "His death came so quickly that it was still unexpected."

During his tenure at Tech, Klock was a member of the South Central Modern Language Association, the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese and the Southwest Council of Latin American Studies. He was also a member of Alpha Chi and Sigma Delta Phi honor societies.

One of Klock's recent achievements came last year when his book about Brazilian

novelist Aluisio Azevedo was published in Canada.

Klock was born July 4, 1938, in Evanston, Ill. He graduated as the valedictorian from Edinburg High School in 1956 and attended Pan American University in Edinburg. Klock also attended Tulane University in New Orleans where he received his master's and doctorate's degrees in romance language. During this time, he was named a Woodrow Wilson Fellow and received a National Defense Foreign Language Fellowship.

He is survived by his wife, Celea Reyes, daughter Lillian Greathouse, son Sheldon C. Klock III and a grandson.

### **Additional Information**

Sheldon C. Klock Jr. (Sheldon Charles, Frederick, Sheldon E., Jonas, Jacob J., John J., Johannes J. and Hendrick Klock) has two connections back to Hendrick Klock. His Gr. Gr. Grandfather, Jonas Klock married his cousin Mary Klock (Jacob J., Jacob I., Johannes J. and Hendrick Klock). I don't have a lot of information on this Klock family. I know Sheldon C. Klock, Sr. (Jan. 11, 1904-Apr 28 1993) married a Lillian L. (Jan. 29, 1884-Jan 12 1972). After the death of his first wife Lillian, he married Jo L Conner Oct. 27 1973. Both are buried in Resthaven Memorial Park, Lubbock Co., Texas. Sheldon Jr. (obituary above) was the only child that I know about. Sheldon's Grandfather, Frederick Klock (April 03, 1880- Jan. 01, 1934) married Lillian May Lyon (Jan. 29, 1882- Jan. 12, 1972). Not sure where Lillian is buried or if she re-married. Frederick is buried in St. Johnsville Cemetery.

Klock, Olla (Hollenbeck) b. Jan 30, 1890, d. May 23, 1976, wife of Earl. Additional Information: Olla Hollenbeck married Earl E. Klock, the son of Thomas Cade Klock Sr. and Edith Fredenburg. (See line above). Earl and Olla had five children.

Klock, Percy 1897-1967 married Nov. 24, 1919. Additional Information: Percy Klock was another son of Thomas Cade Klock Sr. and Edith Fredenburg. (See line above) Percy married Alice Gale and they had three children.

Klock, Preston E. b. Nov. 27, 1908, d. July 27, 1976 married Jan. 25, 1941. Additional Information: Preston E. Klock was the son of Earl E. Klock and Olga Hollenbeck. Earl Klock was the son of Thomas Cade Sr. and Edith Fredenburg (see line above). I have Preston's first wife as Pauline May Buckman who was born April 26, 1911 and died March 08, 1938. Preston and Pauline had at least one child, Preston Jr. who served in WW-II. His second wife was Madeline A. Mills, who he married in 1941.

Information: Thomas C. Klock married Mary E. Northrop. He was the son of Thomas Cade Klock and Edith Fredenburg. Thomas and Mary had three children.

Klock, Thomas Cade b. 1859, died Nov 18, 1926, married April 24, 1885. Additional Information: Thomas Cade Klock (George Henry, Thomas A., George I., Johannes, Han Henrich and Hendrick Klock) married Edith Fredenburg. Thomas and Edith had nine children.

MacFarlane, Edith E. (Klock) 1915- wife of Rolla E. Additional Information: Edith E. Klock was the daughter of Earl E. Klock and Olga Hollenbeck. Edith married Rolland MacFarlane. No information on children.

Additional Information: I have Maude Klock as the daughter of Lum Klock (Harvey, George G.I., George I., Johannes, Han Henrich and Hendrick Klock) and Elizabeth Hayes. She married Wilbur Thompson below. No additional information.

Thompson, Wilbur A. b. Dec. 16, 1860, d. Feb 22, 1935 married Sept. 26, 1889. Additional Information: Wilber Thompson married Maude Klock above.
