Mark Mayville lives in Walled Lake, Michigan. He is a Medical Technologist and works in a medical laboratory. He married Elena Bahima in Barcelona, Spain in 1976 and they have a son Paul.

Mark is the Great Grandson of Isaac and Alice Mae Klock. "I've been interested in the family Genealogy for many years but only the past year or so seriously." Mark told me in his e-mails.

Mark sent me the picture of his great-grandparents, Isaac Carlton and Alice Mae Klock. Alice M. Klock was born in Michigan in 1882, the daughter of Charles Klock (Isaac, Christian, John J. Jr., John J. Johannes and Hendrick Klock) and Fanny Putman.

"Alice M Klock married Isaac Carlton of Saginaw, MI abt. 1901, they lived in Saginaw and had four sons, Harold b.1903 (my grandfather), William b.1907, Francis b. 1910 and Thoral b. 1913." Mark told me in his e-mails. "The family moved from Saginaw to Detroit sometime between the 1920 and 1930 census. The 1930 census shows Fanny (age 80) living with Alice and Isaac in Detroit. Isaac died in 1963 and I'm not sure but I believe Alice died about 1965.

I remember her as an old woman, with a high pitched sing-song voice, she was a little on the heavy side and had trouble walking so she used a cane. I believe she lived alone at that time and from what I remember it was a typical "old lady" house, with lots of antique furniture and such. Going by my Grandfather, Isaac and Alice must have been wonderful parents because Harold Carlton was the finest man I ever knew. He was smart, sweet, kind, and a-lot of fun." Mark told me.

Charles Klock was born in New York, the son of Isaac Klock and Lucy A. Hartwick. Isaac and Lucy had ten children; Diantha, Charles H., Ira (my great-grandfather) John E., Jason, Horace, Emma, George Grantison, Ella and Allie, who were twins.

Charles Klock married Fanny Putnam, the daughter of William and Irena Putman (Walz) on July 18, 1869, in Tuscola, Co. Michigan. Diantha and her husband Elon M. Waters were the witnesses at the marriage. Diantha was the oldest child of Isaac Klock and Lucy Hartwick, they were married in Le Ray, Jefferson County, N.Y. December 26, 1863. About 1900 Diantha deserted Elon and her children and it is believed she married another man. No one in the family ever heard from her again.

I find no record of Charles Klock after 1880. I don't know if he died or divorced. I know that Fanny remarried a James Ayles about 1894. James Ayles was born March of 1846 in New York. Fanny was born May of 1849 in New York.

Charles K. Smith, state oil inspector, Sioux City, and one of the pioneer settlers, was born in Fort Plain, Montgomery county, N.Y. February 15, 1835. He is the son of Moses and M. (Klock) Smith, natives of New York. Our Subject attended the common schools in his native place until sixteen year of age, when he was sent to Governor Lawrence academy, where he remained two years. He then engaged in the hardware business with his father until twenty years old when he went to Rochester, N.Y. , and worked in a hardware store a year and a half. He then removed to Council Bluffs, Iowa, where he stayed until November, 1855, when he went to Sioux City, and served as postmaster through James Buchannan's administration, having in connection with the postoffice a hardware store. He continued the hardware business until 1864, when he sold out and built a hotel, which he ran until 1871, when he sold that and moved to Merrill, where he built an

elevator and store, which operated until 1873. In that year he disposed of his holdings here and removed to La Mars, where he was in business two years and a half, after which he returned to Sioux City, entering into the real estate and insurance business, which he still continues. He was appointed state oil inspector under Governor Boies. Mr. Smith was married in August, 1860, to Miss Annie, daughter of John and Abigail Kimball, natives of New York. Three children have been born to this union; Lizzie, Fred and Frank. In 1862, during the Indian troubles here, he formed an artillery company of twenty men, of which he was captain, to protect the frontier, and did very valuable service for the city as well as the state. In politics Mr. Smith is a democrat, and has served as mayor of Sioux City. He is identified with the Masonic fraternity.

Charles K. Smith was the son of Moses Smith and Magdalena Klock (Jacob J., Jacob I., Johannes J., and Hendrick Klock. She was born November 01, 1816 and died on February 15, 1835, probably in childbirth. She was 19 when she died.

William Helmer Klock and Agnes Mary Sobiech. William Helmer Klock was the son of Ira Klock and Mary Catharine Helmer. The Klock/Clock Genealogy has Ira Klock as the son of Robert. Ira could also be the son of Peter and Anna Stahring who was the brother of Robert. I know that Ira was directly connected to the family of Peter and Anna Stahring and they had 12 Children that we know of.

Ira Klock born in 1825, and drowned while crossing the Mohawk River at Jacksonburg, September 20, 1888. He is buried in the family plot on the farm, which is located on the Mohawk Valley turnpike, 2 and one half miles west of Little Falls, being a part of the farm once owned by Henry Klock. The fact that Ira was buried in the family plot of Peter Klock, the son of Henry, we can conclude that he was of that line. Ira was a member of Co. C. 10th U.S. Inf., in the Civil War, and at the time of his death was living at Jacksonburg, 2 and 1/2 miles west of Little Falls, N.Y.

Ira's son, Alphonso Klock was 19 when he shot and killed Moses C. Holden. Alphonso had a sister who was mentally challenged. Holden was warned to stay away from her. He already was the father of one illegitimate child. After repeated warning to stay away, Alphonso caught Moses in the barn with his sister. Alphonso shot and killed him. Below is one article that was in the N.Y. Times on August 13, 1880.

Utica, Aug. 12--Alphonso Klock, 19 years old, who admitted the killing of Moses C. Holden, of Herkimer, near Little Falls, on Sunday last, at midnight, had been held by the Coroner for murder in the first degree. Holden was the father of Klock's sister's illegitimate child. Klock says he ordered Holden away, and when the latter threatened him, shot at him to scare him away.

The grand jury found no reason to hold him for trial and he was released from custody. Alphonso married Lucinda Suiter and had three children.

The Search for Olin Klock

Olin Klock was born in the town of Watson, New York on August 21, 1914. He graduated from Lowville Free Academy in 1932.

Olin worked as a mechanic for Bernie Hammon and Hank Nortz in Lowville before becoming the head mechanic for Farney Buick. He then worked in the maintenance department of Eastern Nazarene College in Wollleston, Mass. He worked for the college for 15 years, retiring in 1977. After retiring he worked as a self-employed painter.

Olin married Florence Covey on August 13, 1938. They lived in Pennsylvania for about 12 years and moved to Martinsburg, New York in 1990 where he was one of the founding members of the Martinsburg Volunteer Fire Department. Olin died at age 79 in 1993.

Olin was the son of David and Margaret Moyer Klock. David Klock was born about 1883. He married Margaret Moyer, the daughter of George Moyer. She was born about 1888. David and Margaret had two children; Theodore and Olin. Theodore was born April 23, 1905, married Catherine Nage October 25, 1930 and died at age 75.

I have been unable to find the line of David Klock who married Margaret Moyer. David lived in Martinsburg, Lewis, New York in 1930. If you have any information, please e-mail me at Daveanddarla2000@yahoo.com.

Obituary of C.M. Calhoun Unknown Newspaper Clipping April 22, 1958

Clarence M. Calhoun, 84 of 114 Franklin street, died at 11:30 this morning at his home. He had been ill since last November.

Mr. Calhoun is survived by his wife, Mrs. Lucy N. Cornack Calhoun; a son, Eugene Calhoun, 516 Bradley street; a daughter Mrs. Edna Draper, 686 Mill street; and four grandchildren.

Mr. was born Jan. 24, 1874, on Wellesley Island, a son of Almarian and Elizabeth Heath Calhoun. He lived on Wellesley Island, until he was 24 years old and for the next ten years he worked on farms in the town of Orleans.

He then moved to Thousand Island Park, where he lived until 1937, when he retired and moved to Watertown. While at Thousand Island Park; Mr. Calhoun owned a fleet of charter boats and also trucked cattle and horses from Canada to the United States, ran a boat livery and gas station and operated a milk market and wood and coal and real estate business. He was constable for six years and served as chief on the fire department.

Mr. Calhoun was married to Miss Mina S. Snell on Nov. 24, 1897. She died May 31, 1955. On Sept 6, 1958 he married Mrs. Lucy Nemier Cornack.

The funeral will be Thursday afternoon at 2 at the Poll Funeral home, 137 Clinton street. Rev. Thomas J. Carlisle, pastor of the Stone Street Presbyterian church, will officiate.

He had been liberally educated, and was general manager of the firm of Farwell & Rhines.
