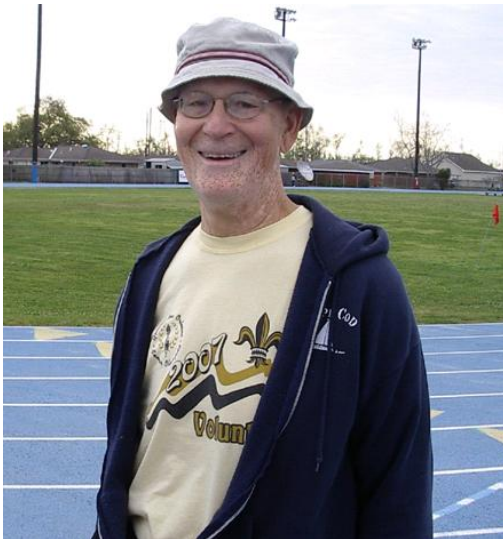

William F. (Bill) Klock

The following obituary was published in
The Times-Picayune 2/5/2008 - 2/6/2008.

William F. (Bill) Klock of Covington, Louisiana, former Administrator of West Jefferson Metal Health Center, passed away on Sunday, February 3, 2008, at the age of 70. He was born October 13, 1937, in Bluefields, Nicaragua. He was one of seven children born to the late Nathan Paul Allen Klock and Sofia Hunter Klock.

Mr. Klock was a graduate of De La Salle High School. He attended Tulane University, where he was on the Tulane Football Team, lettering as a Tackle in 1958-59. He graduated from Tulane University in 1960, with a Bachelor of Arts Degree. After graduation, he pursued his love of sports and was awarded the Heavyweight Olympic Weightlifting and

Power Lifting Champion, the Southern USA Championships, and was a Gold Medal winner in a dual Olympic Weightlifting meet between the United States and Mexico. After winning these accolades, Mr. Klock went back to Tulane and received his Masters in Social Work in 1971.

Sports continued to be a passion in his life. In 1977, Mr. Klock was the Strength Coach for the Washington Redskins under Coach George Allen. He was the 1992 Louisiana State 100-meter and 200-meter Sprinting Champion, 1993 200-meter Champion and runner-up for the shot-put, 1994 shot-put Champion, 1995 Louisiana State Triathlon Champion, 1996 State Bicycling Champion (in the 1-mile, 5-mile and 10-mile), and the Greater New Orleans and St. Tammany Bicyclist winner in 2004. These accomplishments allowed opportunities that he cherished, including being a Committee member for the Greater New Orleans Senior Olympics which often officiated at, Coordinator of the Greater New Orleans Senior Olympic Track and Field Meet, and numerous public events regarding his passion. In 2006, he was selected the Greater New Orleans Regional Senior Athlete of the Year.

Bill is survived by his loving wife of 40 years, Sandra Slaten Klock; his daughter Alexis Klock Butkevich and her husband, Mark Andrew Butkevich; and his grandson Theodore William Butkevich; and numerous other loving family and friends.

Obituary of William F. Klock Continued

I found the obituary of William Frank Klock published in The Times-Picayune 2/5/2008. The Times-Picayune is a daily newspaper published in New Orleans, Louisiana. I wanted to find out if Bill was connected to our Klock family. There are several Klock families that live in Louisiana that are connected.

While researching I was able to locate Andrew Slaten. Andrew lives in Montgomery Village, Maryland and was the brother-in-law of the late William Klock. "I've been to Ft. Klock," Andrew told me. "I moved down to MD 3 years ago after living in Elmira New York for over 10 years. My work (emergency management) led me to travel all over the state!" Andrew told me in his e-mails.

Andrew left a posting on Genealogy.com that he was looking for information on the Klock Family. I was able to contact him through this genealogy forum. "I've wondered about the connection between the New York Klocks and the Louisiana Klocks. It gets complicated because there are at least 2 if not 3 distinct Klock lines down in Louisiana. If you have any info that can clear the log jam, I'd love to see it." Andrew told me. We exchanged information and Andrew sent me what he had collected.

William was born in Nicaragua on October 13, 1937 to Nathan and Sofia Hunter Klock. Nathan's father was Edward Klock born circa 1880 in Germany according to information sent to me by Andrew. Edward married Rosa Mary Drexler. Edward's parents were Jacob and Marguerite (Stock) Klock. Jacob was born in France in June 1828 and his wife Marguerite was also born in France in June of 1838. From the obituary, information Andrew sent me and some additional research, William was not connected to the Klock Family of the Mohawk Valley. He may be connected somewhere farther back in Germany or France. Who knows?

Correction to Klock Connections

Johnsville she was the daughter of the late Willis and Katherine Klock Shaffer. She was 88.

A lifelong area residence, Mrs. Dyer was a graduate of Fort Plain High School and attended the Eastern School for Physicians Aides in New York City. During WW-II she returned to Fort Plain where she worked for a time at I.M. Yordon Box Manufacturing Company and Beech Nut in Canajoharie. For many years she served as the administrator of the Canajoharie Nursing Home and the Katharine Nursing Home in Amsterdam, until her retirement in 1976.

Mrs. Dyer enjoyed music, gardening, card playing, fishing and was a loyal Mets fan. She also was an avid bowler and was a 25 year member of the Mr. and Mrs. American Bowling League in Amsterdam. Daughter of the American Revolution and a supporting member of the Fort Plain Museum and Fort Klock restoration. Above all she loved her family, especially her grandchildren. She will be sadly missed by all who knew her. On January 20, 1948 she was united in marriage to Howard A. Dyer. That union lasted 50 years until his passing on July 2, 1998.

Her loving family includes her two daughters, Deborah Skivington and her husband Kevin and Katharine Brust and her husband William all of Buel; five grandchildren, Mark Skivington of Glen Falls, Beth Latini and her husband Lawrence of Canandaigua, Mary Skivington of Fort Plain, Sarah Shibley of New York City, Diana Kelley and her husband Gary of Fredericksburg, VA; one uncle Adam Klock of Ovid, NY and cousins.

Death Notice of Dr. Ross Klock

The Wellsboro Agitator

April 5, 1905

Wellsboro, Pa

The sad intelligence has been received here of the death by drowning of Dr. Ross Klock at Ottumwa, Kan, son of Mr. Henry H. Klock, formerly of Charleston, Dr. Klock was graduated about a year ago from medical college and he returned to his home at Ottumwa and opened an office and had already secured a large practice. On the night of March 18th he was returning from a professional visit and was drowned while attempting to ford a river which was in flood. His body was recovered the next day. Mr. Henry Klock, the young doctor's son, left Tioga county for the West soon after he came home from the war. His life has been full of sad experiences. Of his seven children only two daughters are now left. Old and feeble, he is now deprived of the only son, in whom he took so much pride and on whom he depended.

He is a brother of Messra Jeremiah Klock of this borough and Hiram and Andrew Klock, of Charleston. Dr. Ross Klock was a cousin of Mr. Milton Klock.

Additional Information: Dr. Ross Klock was the son of Henry H. Klock (Adam A., Adam, Adam Johannes, Adam, Col. Jacob Klock and Hendrick Klock) and Emma Butler. I have Henry H. Klock and Emma Butler with five children. I do not know the names or dates of birth of the other two children.

Thomas Davis, son of John and a native of Wales, England, came to America with his father when ten years old and settled in Litchfield, Herkimer county. In 1857 Mr. Davis married Sarah M., daughter of Jacob KLOCK, and in 1865 located in Lyndon, of which town he was supervisor in 1873 and 1874. In 1882 he came to this town and settled as a farmer at

Cadiz, being elected supervisor of Franklinville in 1891 and 1892. Mr. Davis in public and private is an exemplary citizen, serving his constituents with honor and credit, and in all matters of importance to the town and county he takes a deep interest.

FORMER HERKIMER COUNTY MAN

Thomas Davies, Well Known In This Vicinity
Several Years Ago,
Died Yesterday At Ischua 9/25/1912

News of the death of Ischua, Cataraugus County, yesterday of Thomas Davies, a former Herkimer County man, was received. Mr. Davies was well known in the vicinity in which he lived and possessed many friends. Thomas Davies was born in Newtown, North Wales, August 7, 1831. In 1840 he came with his parents to this country locating in Litchfield. He was one of a family of six brothers and sisters, only one of whom survive him. Early in life Mr. Davies married Sarah Klock in German Flatts, who died in 1909. In 1850 he started for California, but was taken ill with yellow fever while on the Isthmus of Panama and was obliged to return home. The following year he again started for California, where he made his home for several years. Returning from the West, Mr. Davies moved to German Flatts and later to Franklinville, where he lived until a few years ago, when he moved to Ischua. Up to a few years ago he followed the occupation of a farmer. He was a Republican in politics and served as supervisor from the towns of Lindon and Franklinville for several terms. He was also a director of Franklinville Bank. The only near relative surviving is a brother Richard Davies, aged 83, who resides in Sauquoit. He leaves several nephews and nieces.

Thomas Davies married Sarah Klock, the daughter of Jacob Klock (Jacob Clock, Jacob Conrad Clock, Conrad Clock and Hendrick Klock) and Abigail Ayers Woolever. Thomas and Sarah did not have any children according to my records.

Lowville--Klock Edick, 89, died yesterday at his home near Castorland where he lived with his son, Maynard Edick.

He was born April 30, 1858, son of Anson and Lany Klock Edick at Point Peninsula, town of Lyme on Feb. 20, 1883. He was married to Addie Belle Lanpher, who died 12 years ago.

Mr. Edick had been a farmer for the greater part of his life, coming to his present home in the town of Denmark 33 years ago.

Surviving are four daughters, Mrs. A.J. Post, Syracuse, Mrs. Laura Wakefield, Lowville, Mrs. G.W. Burrington, Marcellus, Mrs. T.V. Devercaux, New York, and three sons, Leon of Osceola, and Fred and Maynard of Castorland, also a sister, Mrs. Minnie Moflet, Lowville, and two brothers, Burton of Lowville, and Eugene of Martinsburg.

Funeral services with Rev. W.R. Carter of the Methodist Church of Beaver Falls officiating. will be held Monday at 2 P.M. at the Dekin funeral home in Lowville, where friends may call Sunday at 2 to 4 and 7 to 9 P.M. D.S.T. Burial in Castorland Cemetery.
