Known as Honorich, Jr., Henry, Han Hendrik,

Military Service:

Was a private in Col. Jacob Klock's (his brother) 2nd Tryon Co. New York State Militia.

Honorich took the oath of Naturalization on Jan 3, 1715/16, as Hans Hendrick Clock. (Albany County, New York Naturalization) His descendants have continued to use the Clock spelling.

Honorich, Jr. (2)

In a letter to H L C W 2-20-1950, Mr. Prindle says: "Honorich, Jr. undoubtedly came into the world as Johan Herrich, in early records referred to as Hans Hendrick. Honorich is a compound name composed of Hon for Johan and Rich for Henrich. There is here a conglomeration of Dutch and Palatine names - Hans and Hendrich are Dutch and Hon or Han and Henrich or Heinrich are German".

Honorich, Jr. was mentioned in his father's will made in 1742 as Honorick.

No b or bp records have been found for either Honorich, Jr. or Col. Jacob.

Honorich, Jr. was a Pvt. in Col. Jacob Klock's Reg't, the 2nd Tryon Co. New York State Militia.

This compiler first found Honorich, Jr. in the pamphlet "Old Palatine Church" where it was mentioned that he had a son Hendrick whose marriage to Anna Yung (Young) 1-7-1762 is recorded in the Dutch Reformed Church of Stone Arabia, Palatine District. In these same records were found dates of the births of the children of this Hendrick and

Anna Young Clock. Among these children appears the name of Johann George (George H.), father of Samuel Clock who was grandfather of the compiler of this genealogy. This confirms the descent of this line from the first Hendrick Clock, in whose will the "C", spelling was used.

Honorich, Jr. m Jacomyntie, whom he calls Jacobarqy in his will.

(Ulster records Vol, 1, pg 232 gives the two names as the same Dutch name).

The will of Henry (Honorich, Jr.) designated in the record of wills as BA9691, dated May 14-1759, was made in Canajoharie, NY. Where he evidently remained when other of his family removed to the region of St. Johnsville. A copy of this will had been sent to H L C W by Miss Edna L. Jacobsen of the Library of the State of New York, in Albany, but it was recognized as that of Honorich, Jr. only when Mr. Prindle sent the names of Honorich, Jr.'s children which he had found and which proved to be the ones mentioned in the will.

The will, as written up, shows the name to be Henry Clock

his and the signature HK To be Henry Clock

Mark

(Han) Henry called his property "the estate of my land at Stonraby" (Stone Arabia). In the will, Jacomyntie (Jacobany) was designated to receive "good maintenance and five pounds in money from his estate and a home with Johannes", executor of the will. The daughters "if and when they marry" were to receive twenty-five, twenty-five, and thirty pounds in money respectively, and "if in case the money which lay in Albany, be lost by the enemies, he (Johannes) is free from it". In additions each daughter was to receive "1 iron pot, 1 bason, 1 dish, doz. Blates, and 1 cow". Each son was bequeathed fifty acres of land, and all other property was to be divided between the sons Johannes and Hendrick, equal share.

Also he was a patentee holder of property located on the south side of the Mohawk River along with George Klock and William Keller and others.

Notes for JOHANNAS BELLINGER:

Johannes or John Billinger was a Lieutenant in Col. Jacob Klock's second Regiment and died in the Battle of Oriskany, New York on August 6, 1777. He had two son's that also died in that battle, John and Fred. He inherited 1311 acres from his father's Harrison Patent Land in Jt. Johnsville.

SOK Genealogy;

Maria Lena Klock (No. 14 1/2) baptised June 9th. 1727 (bible record says June 9, 1728) married Johannes Bellinger, born about 1725, who was a Lieutenant in the Palatine Regiment of the Tyron County Militia commanded by Col. Jacob Klock was killed at the Battle of Oriskany, as receipts for the payment of seven years half pay to his children, Elizabeth and Henry audited accounts of the New York records indicate.

Although only three daughters are found in the Stone Arabia Church records belonging to Johannes and Maria Klock Bellinger, there was space between birth of Margretha born 1751 and Elizabeth born 1760, for other to have come, which caused one to wonder if the above Johannes Bellinger is not the one mentioned by "Simms" in his Frontiersmen fo New York (Vol. 2, page 517) in the narrative of Phillip Helmer the Troy, in which he speaks of the "seven virgin daughters of Johannes Bellinger as being between the ages, say of fifteen and twenty five years."

Johannes Klock farm was located at a point near where the boundary line of Montgomery County joins that of Herkimer County at East Creek History of Southern New York and Hudson River Valley. After the war was over, Johannes moved to Oppenheim, Fulton County, east side of Canada Creek, two miles up from the Mohawk Valley Turnpike.

Johannes Klock, (No 14). born Sept 1,1730 ,died Jan 15,1815, married Mar 11, 1759, Anna Margretha Shoemaker, born Nov 3,1729,died Sept 3 ,1818, daughter of Thomas Shoemaker.

Johannes Klock seems to have lived at, or near Stone Arabia previous to the Revolution, as did his father Henrich, whose name appears with 32 others in a letter of testimony from the Stone Arabia Church to the Classis of Amsterdam, Holland, of the good character and correct standing of their pastor. The Rev Johannes Schuyler.

Simms in his "Frontiermen of New York" in his account of the battle of Stone Arabia, speaks of him as follows; "I learned from George M Bauder Esq. -- a son of Michael Bauder who was a ranger in the revolution -- where this burial took place. His mother was Lana, a daughter of John Klock. The Bauders and Klocks were among the earliest German families in Palatine where my informant was born Aug 28, 1768. (Note: This year date should be 1785) After the battle of stone Arabia John Klock drew the bodies of Browns men together on a sled, but there was no snow upon the ground.

They were brought near Fort Paris which stood between the "Corners" , and interred, as I believe , a few rods south east of the school house. The pit dug was a trench some twelve by sixteen feet, sufficiently wide to take in two lengths of bodies; and upon its stood Miss Lana Klock and saw the bodies interred."

After the war he removed from Stone Arabia and located on a farm in the present town of Openheim, Fulton county on the easterly side of the East Canada creek, about two miles up stream from the Mohawk valley turnpike. Of this farm he and his faithful wife spent their closing days. They were buried side by side in the family plot, on a rise of ground not far from their dwelling place.

When the new power plant and dam was built, near the site of the one constructed by Beardslee at an earlier date, the old Klock farm was purchased by the power company, and the building taken down and removed. The remains of those that were buried in the family plot, together with their tombstones (with the exception of that of John Klock, which seems to have become lost in the transfer in some unknown way, but which at one time stood with the others there.) were removed to the cemetery at Inghams Mills, N.Y. and re-interred there.

Tradition says the he served the French and Indian war, and no doubt tradition is right, but we find no evidence to verify it. However we find him serving in the 2nd Regiment of Tyron county Militia, Col Jacob Klock commanding. His name also appears in several documents relating to bounties, pay, ect., at the Comptrollers Office at Albany, N.Y. His Will is on file at the County Clerks Office at Fonda N.Y. It was probated Feb. 15, 1817. The legatees were his wife, Anna Margretha, and his two grandsons, John G. Klock, and George G. I. Klock.

Of the children born of this union —and no doubt there were more than those listed below we find only the "lines" of two that of Magdalana mentioned by Simms and quoted above —and George I. of Johann Thomas and Johannes we find no trace, other then their record of birth in the Stone Arabia church books. This is to be deplored since this "line" has given many fine, upright men and women to this great commonwealth.

Note: (additional) facts which have been learned since the line of Maria Lena Klock (No. 14 1/2) was inscribed)

Philip Stowits (the father of Michael) was born at teh Hague, Holland and came to this country in 1750. He settled just south of the present Currytown in the town of Root, Montgomery county, where he followed the occupation of farming until his death. In 1757 he married the widow of Sander Lewis, whoes maiden name was Mary Ecker (or Eckler). The father of Sander Lewis was David Lewis who married the widow of Jacobus Cromwell. Her name before her marriage with Cromwell was Maria Phillinse, and her marriage with David Lewis occurred on Jan 20, 1716. Two sons were known to have been born to David and Maria, Sander biptised October 26th 1722, and William baptised on November 5, 1720, and both at Schenectady.

On December 26th., 1722, Sander Lewis purchased from William and Catherine Curry, 200 acres of land at teh southeast corner of Lot No. 3 in the Curry Patent, formerly granted to Peter Lewis. THree of the five children born to Sander and Mary (Maria Magdlena Esterin) were recorded int the Stone Arabia Church books as follows; Filipina baptised May 27, 1743, Adam baptised May 27, 1744 and one other whose name is illegible. Sander Lewis probably died about 1754, or shortly after, for in 1757 we find his widow becoming the bride of Philip Stowits.

Philip Stowits and his wife were the parents fo three children, Sophia, born 1758, who married a grandson of Hendrik Hudson, Michael born in 1763, who married Elizabeth Bellinger, and George born in 1765. Phillip Stowits was a private in the 3rd Batallion of Tyron County Militia, and served under Col Frederick Fisher, whe he was killed on the fatal field of Oriskany, where his name can be found on the monument there. Philip was a very religious man and it is said that when he left home to join his regiment before that illfated expedition he read te 18th Psalm for strength and guidance.

Michael, his son was also a private in teh same regiment, and as such was no doubt in that bloody conflict. It is recorded that when he was about 18 years of age he was taken prisoner while attending a funeral at Sprakers October 24th., 1781, taken to Fort Niagara, and later removed to Montreal where he was held a prisoner until the close of the war. --SOK--

Born at Stone Arabia, he was a witness to all the horrors of war as practiced by Indians and Tories alike, when on Oct 19, 1780, Col. Brown and some forty of his men were slain at that place; whose bodies, "Simms says" were drawn from the field by John Klock, his father.

In the year 1785 he married Barbara Bauder, born July 13, 1765, died July 14, 1842, the daughter of Michael Bauder and Barbara Beyer. George I. and his wife lived on the homestead farm of his father after the decease of the later, and during the remainder of their life. They were buried in the family plot on farm; later their remains were taken up and reinterred in the cemetery at Inghams Mills, N.Y., as described in the sketch of John Klock. This old "Klock" farm was situated at a point near where the boundary line of Montgomery and Fulton counties joins that of Herkimer at the East Canada Creek.
